

# LYON COLLEGE RESIDENCE HALL FAQs

## Do I have to live on campus?

Single students under 21 years old at must live on campus or commute from their parents' primary residence within 45 miles.

## Can I have a single room?

Lyon College provides medical singles which require approval from the Director of Academic Support and Accessibility.

## What are the res hall bathrooms like?

Community-style bathrooms are maintained by housekeeping and shared among residents on the floor in certain halls. Suite-style bathrooms are shared between two rooms and maintained by residents in specific housing areas. Pod-style bathrooms are individual bathrooms grouped in pods, with each bathroom for private use and maintained by housekeeping in designated halls.

## What should I bring with me?

When preparing for college, coordinate with your roommate to plan items like a TV and mini fridge to prevent duplicating items.

## What size are the beds?

All mattresses in all halls are twin xl mattresses.

## How big is my room?

All residence hall and apartment room dimensions are available on each hall-specific page on the Lyon website. All room measurements are approximate.

\*Wilson Rogers Hall, McRae Hall, and Sturbridge Apartments are not yet featured on the Lyon website. Standard Wilson Rogers and McRae Hall rooms measure 15'x11'. Sturbridge rooms measure 12'x10'.

## Can I have College furniture removed from my room?

All residence hall rooms come furnished. Each room (except those designated as singles) contains two twin XL beds, two desks, two desk chairs, two closets/armoires/dressers. College furnishings must remain in the space to which they are allocated.

## How can I decorate my residence hall room?

You may decorate your room in any way that does not permanently change the room's structure. Some students contact their roommates before arriving to decide on a color scheme for their room, oftentimes purchasing matching bed linens, soft-installing matching headboards, area rugs, etc. Additionally, family photos, posters, and artwork are all great ways to personalize a space. You may hang items such as these on the wall using masking tape or some other low-tack tape or putty that does not damage the wall surface.

## If my personal property is damaged or stolen, does the College replace it?
